1.3. Requisitos previos

As the European Parliament elections coming up, set for June 6-9, 2024, we extend an invitation to young Europeans to become pivotal influencers in this crucial event. Our course is designed to train the EU's young voters in Democracy and Journalism, turning them into authentic youth #referencers among their peers. Particularly looking at two trending topic political areas: Migration and Climate Change, the focus will be on the European Parliament as the single citizen's direct representative institution and on its political groups and their proposals for the upcoming legislative term to respond to them. Moreover, this interdisciplinary course offers a broad understanding of the impact of these issues on our daily lives and the EU's policy responses so far. The program delves into the communication strategies of the European Union and the European Parliament political groups, enhancing students' grasp of how these entities reach EU voters. Our goal is to not only educate but also to empower students to become influential voices in European politics and media. This program is a unique opportunity to engage directly with the political process, gain practical skills, and make a meaningful impact on the 2024 European Parliament elections.

2. Métodos Docentes

The training combines online and face-to-face learning modalities. Online sessions, led by experts in political sciences, international relations, law and communication, provide a comprehensive foundation on the complexities of Migration and Climate Change and the EU's approach to these challenges.

The on-site training in Seville is where the course truly comes to life. Students will participate in:

- Interactive Workshops: Led by seasoned professionals, these sessions are designed to develop skills in digital communication, political advisement, and media strategy. Moreover, they will also work on policy analysis, advocacy, or crisis simulations.
- **Field Visits**: Students will visit key European research agencies, data and content verification centers, and other significant sites, providing real-world context to their learning.
- **Direct Election Involvement**: Participants will actively cover the elections through a university's digital media, engaging in political campaigns to promote youth voting, conducting interviews, reports, and field verifications.

Lectures will take the form of master classes, fostering interactive engagement between teachers and students.

Emphasis will be placed on the gradual development of students and their active participation.

Students are required to prepare for classes in advance. Study materials available on Moodle can serve as supplementary resources for reading and comprehension.

At the conclusion of each thematic unit, students will engage in a series of self-assessment exercises to gauge their understanding and proficiency in applying and connecting the concepts covered.

Moreover, students will engage in individual or group work, depending on the context, involving problem-solving and case analysis.

Personal interviews will be conducted to monitor the progress of each student.

3. Tiempo estimado de trabajo del estudiante

This course has a workload of 6 ECTS credits, amounting to 60 face-to-face instruction (online + formative week in Sevilla) and 90 non-Presential hours (autonomous work).

4. Métodos de evaluación y porcentaje en la calificación final
